Ron Fouchier is professor in Molecular Virology at Erasmus MC Rotterdam, where he is also the deputy head of the Viroscience department. He obtained a PhD in 1995 for HIV/AIDS research at the University of Amsterdam and continued HIV work at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine. Late 1998 he started a Molecular Virology research line on respiratory viruses, in particular influenza, at Erasmus MC. His team contributed substantially to the identification and characterization of various “new” viruses, such as human metapneumovirus, human coronavirus NL63, SARS coronavirus, MERS coronavirus, and influenza A virus subtype H16. Currently, his research is focused on respiratory viruses of humans and animals, antigenic drift, and influenza virus zoonoses, transmission and pandemics. Ron is elected member of the Royal Dutch Academy of Sciences (KNAW), the Royal Holland Society of Sciences and Humanities (KHMW) and Academia Europaea. In 2006 he received the Heine-Medin award of the European Society for Clinical Virology, in 2013 the Huibregtsen award for top innovative science with societal impact and in 2023 the MW Beijerinck Virology Prize of the KNAW. Fouchier is a web-of-science Highly Cited author.
