Daniel Gaudry was the secretary of IABS from 1985 to 2020 and served as the president from 2008 to 2010. In 1968, Dr. Gaudry began his career at the Mérieux Institute in Lyon, France. He played a crucial role in the development and management of the avian product line at the Mérieux Institute, then at Rhône Mérieux, and finally at Merial, all of which stemmed from the Mérieux Institute.

Among Dr. Gaudry's professional milestones is the creation and initial development of the American veterinary subsidiary of the company in Athens, Georgia, in the 1980s. Since then, the company has become a major player in the veterinary field in the United States. During his years at Rhône Mérieux, Dr. Gaudry successfully obtained the first USDA-approved rabies vaccine for subcutaneous administration, a significant achievement in the field of veterinary medicine in the United States. In 1981, on the recommendation of Dr. Charles Mérieux, Dr. Gaudry was elected to the board of directors of IABS. Dr. Gaudry earned his Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) from the National Veterinary School of Toulouse and later specialized in immunology, obtaining a degree from the University of Lyon in 1969.

Dr. Gaudry holds dual American and French citizenship and divides his time between France and the United States.
