



The Role of Real-World Evidence for Regulatory and Public Health Decision Making for Accelerated Vaccine Deployment

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Laurence Torcel-Pagnon is an Epidemiologist (MSc). She has been working in industry on vaccine preventable infectious diseases for 15 years collaborating in several epidemiological studies and international projects. For the last 10 years, she has been more specifically engaged in European and worldwide public-private partnerships (ADVANCE, DRIVE, COVIDRIVE, GIHSN, BeCOME), co-leading the development of large Real World Evidence platforms for disease surveillance and vaccine effectiveness monitoring (Flu, COVID, RSV and other respiratory viruses). She is acting as Executive Officer at the Foundation for Influenza Epidemiology supporting the Global Influenza Hospital Surveillance Network. Currently, Laurence is coordinating the evidence generation strategy for Sanofi influenza vaccines (licensed products), working in close collaboration with internal experts/functions and maximizing collaborative approaches with external stakeholder networks and platforms.
